Election Supervisory Board Resolution: 2026-007
In Res. Compliance with Building Policies

Election Supervisory Board Member Samuel Huron delivered the majority opinion of the board:

“In the matter of an Executive Alliance failing to comply with PCL building policies.”

On Tuesday, March 3, 2026, at 3:28 A.M. CST, Lillian Veazey submitted a complaint (Complaint ID: 7) against the Executive Alliance, Cate Kratovil and Bailey English, alleging that they violated **Title II, Chapter VII, §7.11 Campus-Wide Election Code:**

“COMPLIANCE WITH BUILDING POLICIES. *All candidates will be responsible for ensuring that their campaign activities and/or campaign materials are in compliance with university building policies.*”

Complainant Lillian Veazey alleged that the Cate Kratovil and Bailey English Executive Alliance failed to comply with building policies, specifically at the Perry-Castañeda Library, as required per Title II, Chapter VII, §7.11 Campus-Wide Election Code. Veazey asserted that the security guard on duty at the PCL gave a verbal warning to another Executive Alliance against distributing campaign materials inside and was distracted at the time that the Cate Kratovil and Bailey English Executive Alliance were seen entering the library with flyers. Veazey argued that the Cate Kratovil and Bailey English Executive Alliance should not have entered the building with the aforementioned campaign materials with the intent to distribute them.

The Cate Kratovil and Bailey English Executive Alliance stated to the Board that they had prior permission to distribute flyers granted through an email chain with the Director of Library Operations at the University of Texas at Austin. The Executive Alliance then presented the board with a physical copy of the email correspondence with this individual outlining the permission that had been granted to them.

Upon further questioning by the Board, the Cate Kratovil and Bailey English Executive Alliance stated that they did not directly receive or hear any verbal warning and distributed campaign materials based on the correspondence between them and the Director of Library Operations at the University of Texas at Austin.

Based upon these facts, the Election Supervisory Board has ruled that the Cate Kratovil and Bailey English Executive Alliance did not violate Title II, Chapter VII, §7.11 Campus-Wide Election Code.

In conclusion, The Election Supervisory Board submits its resolution on Thursday, March 5th, 2026, in a six-to-zero majority of the board members who were present at the hearing.
